

Chile Llaima Volcano erupts

The Llaima volcano in southern Chile erupted on Tuesday the 1st of January 2008, sending a huge plume of smoke into the air. It is considered a minor eruption, although some tourists were evacuated.

The eruption has no impact at all on Rincon Lithium or Cia. Minera Santa Bárbara plants as our businesses are conducted about 1400 km away.

The Llaima Volcano, one of the largest and most active volcanoes in Chile, is in the Araucania region in southern Chile, inside Conguillio National Park and about 82 kilometres from the city of Temuco and 663 km southeast of Santiago.
